

## Mediterranean consultation between IUCN Councillors, Chairmen of IUCN National Committees and IUCN Secretariat

Malaga, Spain, February 21 - 22, 2003

## Background

IUCN – The World Conservation Union was founded in 1948 and brings together 79 states, 112 government agencies, 760 NGOs, 37 affiliates, and some 10,000 scientists and experts from 181 countries in a unique worldwide partnership. Its mission is to influence, encourage and assist societies throughout the world to conserve the integrity and diversity of nature and to ensure that any use of natural resources is equitable and ecologically sustainable. The IUCN Centre of Mediterranean Cooperation started its activities in October 2001, with a mission to influence, encourage and assist Mediterranean societies to conserve and sustainably use the natural resources of the region, as well as work with IUCN members and cooperate with other agencies that share the objectives of IUCN.

The five key themes that the IUCN Centre for Mediterranean Cooperation is working on include:

- a) Biodiversity conservation
- b) Islands
- c) Sustainable use of natural resources
- d) Water resources and catchments
- e) Arid lands, transition areas and desertification
